

Respect of Persons

For a long time, evil spiritual forces have been trying to create enmity between men. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places (Ephesians 6:12). One tactic used to divide people is on the basis of race. Men have different physical characteristics, such as the color of one's skin, but that should not be a cause of enmity nor hostility. In fact, it is sinful to behave that way. The Bible says, But if ye have respect to persons, ye commit sin, and are convinced of the law as transgressors (James 2:9). James makes that inspired statement in the context of the assembly showing preferential treatment of one man over another based upon appearance; which in this particular case was based upon the clothing worn. One man wore "a gold ring" and "goodly apparel," indicating he was rich, while the other wore "vile raiment," indicating he was poor (James 2:1-7). So, James begins that passage with a command from God: My brethren, have not the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory, with respect of persons (Jas. 2:1).

If you are a respecter of persons, that means you are "one whose behavior toward people is influenced by their social status, prestige, etc." (Collinsdictionary.com). To have a good understanding of what it looks like to <u>not</u> show respect of persons, consider the passage in Romans 2, which speaks of the judgment of God. God will render to every man according to his deeds (Romans 2:6). In that chapter, Paul writes this will be applied to both Jews and Gentiles (vv. 9-10), for there is no respect of persons with God (v. 11). The race of a person will not matter, but their deeds will. Martin Luther King, Jr. hoped this godly characteristic would spread through the country, as he said, "I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character."

Because of racism, many have been subjected to slavery, oppression, and murder. Thanks be to God that slavery was abolished in this country. Indeed, the word of God had much to do with that, as it became hard to "kick against the goads" for many people. The word of God was working on them, as they pondered passages like Genesis 1:27: So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. Or, Matthew 7:12: Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets. The book of Philemon is about a man who had escaped from slavery and became a Christian. He went back to his slave master under the instruction of the apostle Paul, who wrote to Philemon, Onesimus' master, saying, For perhaps he therefore departed for a season, that thou shouldest receive him forever; not now as a servant, but above a servant, a brother beloved, specially to me, but how much more unto thee, both in the flesh, and in the Lord? If thou count me therefore a partner, receive him as myself (Philemon 15-17). Then he wrote, Having confidence in thy obedience I wrote unto thee, knowing that thou wilt also do more than I say (v. 21). Is this verse possibly referring to Philemon setting Onesimus free?


