The Voice of Thanksgiving

If you reverse the order of the compound word, thanksgiving, you have its definition: giving thanks. When you give thanks, you are giving something to someone that is intangible, unlike giving a gift that can be seen. So how do you give something to someone that they cannot touch?

The Bible says that we can do this by our words with which we communicate; specifically, when we thank God. Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name (Hebrews 13:15 NKJV). You can do this through prayer to God. Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God (Philippians 4:6). You can also do this by singing hymns to God. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord (Colossians 3:16). Grace in this verse means thankfulness. In fact, everything we do, when done in humble obedience to God, should reflect an attitude of thanksgiving. And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him (Colossians 3:17).

We should express our feelings of thanksgiving to God often. By doing so, we are admitting that all good things we have are from Him, and thus our love and devotion for Him grows with each passing day. Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning (James 1:17). To admit this is to have the proper view toward our material possessions. Only a humble person can do this. One may protest that he has worked hard for his wealth. Hard work is commendable and commanded. For even when we were with you, we commanded you this: If anyone will not work, neither shall he eat (2 Thessalonians 3:10). But everyone must remember that it is because of God we have what we have, and not of ourselves. The LORD makes poor and makes rich; He brings low and lifts up (1 Samuel 2:7). Therefore, we should give thanks to our God for all with which He has blessed us. This thankful attitude will align us with our actual roles on this earth, for we are stewards and not owners. God is the owner, as He says in the Psalms: If I were hungry I would not tell you, For the world is Mine, and all it contains (Psalm 50:12 NASB). A thankful heart is a good and humble heart.

On the other hand, to be unthankful is to walk the path of foolishness and eternal darkness. For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse, because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, <u>nor were thankful</u>, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened. Professing to be wise, they became fools (Romans 1:20-22 NKJV). Sin and apostasy take root in an unthankful heart. The rest of chapter one of Romans lists the abominable sins these people practiced, such as homosexuality (vv. 26-27), murder (v. 29), being disobedient to parents (v. 30), and being unmerciful (v. 31). These resulted because they were not thankful (v. 21).

May our mindset be like Jonah's when he prayed to God from the belly of a great fish, in which he prayed with the voice of thanksgiving (Jonah 2:9). It is difficult to sin when you are thanking God. Rather, it pleases Him when you offer thanks. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18).
